C. J. Cherryh's first science fiction novel, *Gate of Ivrel*, 1976. She received the John W. Campbell Award for Best New Writer at SunCon, 1977 Worldcon. In 1979, she won her first Hugo Award for "*Cassandra*," at SeaCon in Brighton, UK. At Chicon IV, Chicago, 1982, her novel *Downbelow Station* won the Hugo and in 1989, *Cyteen* won the Hugo at Noreascon III in Boston. *Cyteen* also won the Locus Award for best SF Novel of 1988.

Born 9/1/42 in St. Louis, Missouri, and presently residing in Edmond, Oklahoma, which is located about ten miles north of Oklahoma City

David Cherry, a multiple award-winning professional artist, is consistently ranked as one of the best fantasy and science fiction artists in the country. David has painted covers for over 30 paper back books, written short stories, and even has a series of trading cards featuring his work.

Charity Auction

We will be hosting two separate Charity Auctions. The other will be a special auction of books. Only First Editions or an Advance Reading Copy that has been autographed by the author will be presented. A complete list of books to be auctioned is on our website but a sampling of authors is: Greg Bear, Terry Brooks, Orson Scott Card, George R.R. Martin, Julian May, Terry Pratchett and Barbara Hambly. The list will continue to be updated as books are added.

The charities that will benefit are Reading is FUNDamental (RIF) and The Challenger Space Center. Reading is FUNDamental (RIF) develops and delivers children's and family literacy programs that help prepare young children for reading and motivate school-age children to read. By the end of this year, RIF will have provided new, free books and other essential literacy resources to more than 5 million children and their families.

The partner charity is The Challenger Space Center of Arizona located in Phoenix and the Challenger Center for Space

Science Education located in the Pima Air and Space Museum in Tucson. The Challenger Space Centers are international, not-for-profit organizations founded by the families of the seven Challenger astronauts who perished in 1986. Originally designed to offer educational program to school children and teachers, the centers are now open to the public with a variety of programs including space missions, stargazing family programs and planetarium programs. FLY A MISSION

As part of our science track of programming we are offering the chance to fly a mission at the Challenger. We have the opportunity to fill two missions on a first come, first served basis. The mission scenario is entitled *Rendezvous With a Comet*, and includes a unique 12-minute launch and docking experience. The mission is a non-stop adventure featuring space emergencies and more. Come on aboard and find out if you've got the right stuff! Everything around participants reminds them of their mission computer consoles, communication

headsets, continuous messages on the loudspeakers, electronic messages, teammates they can only see on video monitors, and hands-on activities at science stations

The Challenger Centers Technology Flight Deck features nearly one million dollars in technology, including a Mission Control room designed after Johnson Space Center; the Spacecraft, designed to simulate a room onboard the International Space Station (ISS); and the ESTM, (Earth Space Transit Module), which transports teams of crew members up to dock with the ISS so they can live and work in space.

There will be an additional charge for this event which will include transportation to and from the Challenger Space Center as well as the mission. Price will be determined depending on how many people sign up for this event.

The 2004 Westcon will be held at the four star / four diamond resort known as the Wigwam Resort. It is located about 25 miles west of Phoenix Sky Harbor Airport. Details on how to get there will be forthcoming in future PRs. For now, I'd like to tell you more about the resort.

Our Hotel Tour

Now that we've covered the Main Lodge containing most all of the function space at the Wigwam Resort, let's move on to the sleeping rooms and the overall grounds.

The Main Lodge described in PR#2 is situated on the southeastern quarter of the resort property. The rest of this quarter is free parking, valet parking, the main driveway to the resort from Wigwam Blvd., front lawn, etc. The northwestern quarter contains the golf courses, putting greens, driving range, pro shop, Grille On The Greens Rotisserie & Lounge, locker rooms, tennis courts, tennis shop & fitness center, volleyball court, basketball court and a few buildings containing rooms and suites. The northeastern quarter contains the blue course, fairway suites (our party area) and more rooms. The southwestern quarter contains the remainder of the rooms and suites as well as one more putting green. All rooms and suites are located in standalone casitas with their own parking areas, all free. A casita is Spanish for little house and you might have 3 or 4 rooms/suites per building, or you might have more like 24 in the newer buildings. Besides the

main pool near the Main Lodge you also have the Courtyard Pool near the newer buildings in the southwest quarter.

For our event in 2004 we have two classes of accommodations: rooms and suites. All rooms are \$105/nt plus tax single/double/triple/quadruple. Not all rooms can sleep up to 4, so check with the resort to make sure you get what you need. The suites are \$135/nt plus tax s/d/t/q as well. Out of 331 total on property they have 138 kings (K), 187 double doubles (2D) and 6 executive suites. The following rooms are \$105/nt: Traditional (1 K only), Superior (38 K or 69 2D), Deluxe Non-Smoking (18 K, 36 2D), Deluxe Smoking (5 K, 10 2D), Deluxe Accessible (6 2D only), and Grand Deluxe (42 K or 46 2D). The following suites are \$135/nt: Superior (16 K or 10 2D), Executive (6 Smoking Doubles only, used by the convention for Green Room, Program Operations, etc.), Deluxe Non-Smoking (2 K or 2 2D), Deluxe Smoking (2 K or 3 2D), Grand (3 K or 3 2D), Tennis (4 K only), and Luxury (3 K only). Bacabi (2K+2D) and Oraibi (2K+2D) are also used by the convention as Gaming and Consuite/Staff Lounge. Some rooms interconnect with other rooms or parlors creating suites. Please call the resort for details about each room description or send me an email and I'll do the best I can.

On our website we plan to have the room layouts (top down view) for each room type and number if possible. That way you'll be able to see what looks like what. With over 50 different types of layouts it is quite a challenge to describe what you'll get with each room type, number, etc. The resort will not guarantee you a specific room

number (it's a long story and has to do with Arizona innkeepers laws), but you may request a given room type when making your reservation. Since the resort has been built up over the years since 1919 it has a unique charm to its rooms and grounds. We hope you enjoy your stay.
